Who is this Messiah?

Parents, Caregivers, and Trusted Adults,

Will you take a journey with us this Advent season?

The Season of Advent is an invitation to wait with anticipation. It's a season where we know there is something really incredible coming soon that isn't quite here yet. But we can already sense how amazing it is going to be even when the waiting is so hard. So we stand on our tiptoes; we hold our breath; we strain our eyes to see what is coming - who is coming. We can even feel the change that will come as a result. This Advent, we invite you into the story in a new way. We invite you into a practice of active waiting full of HOPE, PEACE, JOY, and LOVE. We invite you into the expectation that even here and even now God is doing something amazing. Let's journey together!

This year, let's remember the Christmas Story of God's love found in the Bible. Weary travelers with nowhere to stay found a warm and dry place to have a baby. A messenger, an "angel," found everyday people doing everyday things and told them not to be afraid. The wise ones seeking a king found one who cannot be pushed into violence in the face of bullies.

This story is found in the Bible, yes, but it is also found in our homes, our lives lived each day. Advent is about waiting, so as we wait together this year, the stable scene will be found in your house. The promises kept will take place in your home. This year, the manger is in your house. Someone's coming. Who is coming? Jesus is coming. Come into our homes, Lord Jesus. There's room in our homes for you.

What You'll Need:

- Advent candles traditionally 4 purple candles for waiting and 1 white candle for Christmas!
- Various materials from around your house. How can what you have be used to make a space for what we need? Advent is about waiting, so as we wait together this year, the stable scene will be found in your house. The promises kept will take place in your home. This year, the manger is in your house.
- *Spark Bible* or NRSV Take turns reading, Luke 2: 1-7. Read it every week. If possible, have every person tell the story. It is their story. It is our story.

In this packet you have a **red heart** for December 23 when you join the "Meet at the Manger" Zoom Children's Christmas Story. There are also **twelve stars** to journey with the wise folks during the twelve days of Christmas before Epiphany. We are actively waiting and preparing for the arrival of the Christ Child on Christmas Morning.

On the SecondChurch.org/Children webpage you will find a coloring sheet and a weekly interactive Advent space for your children to explore. PLUS there will be videos of Christmas carols and information about church events.

Let's make a space in our Sacred Space, our Peaceful Place, to remember the Christmas story in our own homes. For that is surely where we will find that it is still Christmas.

Advent Week 1

Being Advent, waiting for the Christ Child

Gather in your Sacred Space, your Holy Place in your home.

Take four candles and cluster them together. You may want to label them "Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love." Traditionally, they would be purple. Light the Hope candle each night of the first week of Advent. Take turns leading and responding.

Leader: Someone is coming. Who is coming?

Everyone: *Jesus is coming!*

All: Come into our home, Lord Jesus. There is room in our home for you.

Read Luke 2:1-7 or tell the Christmas story.

Prayer

God of Hope, you keep promises made to us and to all people. Help us to find you in our home this week. Help us to see your presence in each other's faces and to feel you here with us in our times together.

We pray this in your son Jesus' name.

Amen.

Advent Waiting, finding the Christmas story in your home

Have you ever made a pot or plate out of clay or playdough? When the dough comes out of the bag or jar, it doesn't look like much, does it? But you KNOW that it can become. You KNOW that if you rub it and shape it, then it can be almost anything!

This Advent and Christmas, let's find the story in our own homes. Let's think about the ways that **HOPE** can warm us and fit into spaces we did not even imagine last year. Where have you found the most **HOPE**? Where have you remembered that God is with you? Where have you asked hard questions and felt great big hugs? That place is the space to land, the spot to rest. Like the people of Israel waiting for generations for a promised messiah, or one who makes you safe in times when bad things happen, we remember promises made by God. We know that God will keep those promises. We do not know what the **HOPE** will look like, but we make a space for it in our lives. Let's make a space for it in our homes.

Let's build a stable. There was no room for Mary and Joseph in the expected place, an inn, so they stayed in an unexpected place, which was a stable. Set up an unexpected place to welcome Jesus in your home. Will you use sheets and chairs? Will you use an old cardboard box? Do you have a playhouse you can use?

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This year, we will find room for the **HOPE** of the trust in God's promises in our own homes.

Advent Week 2

Being Advent, waiting for the Christ Child

Gather in your Sacred Space, your Holy Place in your home.

Light the Hope and Peace candles each night of the second week of Advent. Take turns leading and responding.

Leader: Someone is coming. Who is coming?

Everyone: *Jesus is coming!*

All: Come into our home, Lord Jesus. There is room in our home for you.

Read Luke 2:1-7 or tell the Christmas story.

Prayer

God of Peace, you make and keep promises not just to us but to all people. Help us point to those promises at work in the world. Help us to share the excitement of you here with us in our times together. Help us to live so that others can see your promises kept in the world. Help us to shine with your peace.

We pray this in your son Jesus' name.

Advent Waiting, finding the Christmas story in your home

How do you know something BIG is about to happen? Do you hear it on the news? Do you read it in an email? Do you see a poster about it at the grocery? Does a friend tell you? How do you KNOW something BIG is about to happen?

This Advent and Christmas, let's find the story in our own homes. Let's remember the promises made by God. Think of last week. God promised a "messiah," or one who makes us safe in times when very bad things happen. We had HOPE, because we KNOW that God is a promise keeper. We don't keep that news to ourselves! We share it! We tell others. We get ready. We want everyone to be on the look out for that promise kept! In the Bible, how do people know the time is close for the promises to be kept? A baby, John, will tell EVERYONE! Then when the wonderful event happens, how do people find this promise kept? A STAR shines. There is a light unlike any other light. Seeing promises kept and shared out in the world, that is **PEACE**. Sharing the good news, helping other people see the light, that is **PEACE**.

Let's make a star for our stable! Make a bright light so that everyone in your house, or maybe your neighborhood, can see that God's promise is kept. Will you draw a star and hang it up? Maybe you will put a bright light on your tree near your stable. How will you help people know God's **PEACE**, God's promises kept in the world?

Light the Hope, Peace, and Joy candles each night of the third week of Advent. Take turns leading and responding.

Leader: Someone is coming. Who is coming?

Everyone: Jesus is coming!

All: Come into our home, Lord Jesus. There is room in our home for you.

Read Luke 2:1-7 or tell the Christmas story.

Prayer

God of Joy, who makes and keeps promises that bring peace to the world, shower us with your joy. Help us tell of your goodness and share your good news so that others can feel the bubbling-up joy of your presence.

We pray this in your son Jesus' name.

Advent Waiting, finding the Christmas story in your home

Some news is just too good to keep. Some news is a bubbling fullness of feeling that fills up the space in us and around us. That is **JOY**! It fills the space between waiting in hope and the promises at work in peace. It makes the promises explode with **JOY** out into the world for everyone.

We have a star to help people find the stable, how will they know what it means? How will people know that this news is for them? ANGELS! Angels are messengers sent from God. They are the shouting cheerleaders of Good News!

When a promise is made, a promise is trusted, a promise is shared and active in the world, then a promise is SO BIG it showers our lives with **JOY**. Does it go to the palace gates and get announced calmly? Does one fancy group get the news before another? Is it the most important people who get the most important news? Well, this is not that kind of promise. This good news promise is too big for one building, one group, one voice. A whole group of angels, God's messengers, will tell shepherds in a field. They were about the most ordinary of the everyday people and places.



Being Advent, waiting for the Christ Child

Gather in your Sacred Space, your Holy Place in your home.

Light the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love candles each night of the fourth week of Advent. Take turns leading and responding.

Leader: Someone is coming. Who is coming?

Everyone: Jesus is coming!

All: Come into our home, Lord Jesus. There is room in our home for you.

Read Luke 2:1-7 or tell the Christmas story.

Prayer

God of Love, you make and keep promises that bring peace to the world. God whose presence fills the whole world with joy, thank you for loving us. Thank you for being with us. Thank you for sending your son, Jesus as the hope of promises kept, the peace at work, the joy surrounding us, and the love that holds us. Just as Mary held Jesus in her arms and whispered comfort to her new baby boy, you hold us close wrapped in your love. Help us to hold each other close and to love the world as you love us.

We pray this in your son Jesus' name.

Advent Waiting, finding the Christmas story in your home

All of these promises made, trusted, kept, and shared need somewhere to land. What space can we make for the promises in our homes, in our lives? The Christmas story is a story of God's **LOVE** for the world. It came for everyone and everywhere. It came in an unexpected place in an unexpected way. The STRONG KING to SAVE the world was a small baby. The world was not sure what to do with this gift! But first, the baby needed a place to sleep. It needed a place to be safe and cared for. It needed what all babies need. This is the first of a whole lifetime of unexpected ways that this baby will care for us and help us to care for each other. It starts with making a space for the promises to rest.

Let's make a place for the baby in our stable, under our star, near our messenger. The Bible story of Jesus' birth has Mary and Joseph making a space for Jesus in a manger. What can you build or find to fill with warm cloths? Maybe an empty box or a cradle is available? Put it in your stable as a reminder that the promises made a long, long time ago are yours, too. They were promises kept in a stable in Bethlehem though God's gift of **LOVE** in the baby Jesus. We have made a bed for baby Jesus in our stable because we want to remember that God's **LOVE** has a place in our hearts and homes every year, and maybe in a new way this year.

Leader: Someone is coming. Who is coming?

Everyone: *Jesus is coming!*

All: Come into our home, Lord Jesus. There is room in our home for you.

Leader: But wait! Jesus is here! Jesus was here all along.

Light the Christ Candle.

Leader: Jesus is found in our home every day, and we can find God's HOPE, PEACE, JOY, and LOVE all year long.

Read Luke 2:1-7 or tell the Christmas story.

Prayer

God, we found Christmas; or did Christmas find us? We waited and watched and prayed. Thank you for this Advent time to remember that in your son we find the HOPE of promises kept, the PEACE of promises at work in the world, the JOY of promises proclaimed to all, and the LOVE of promises made new in your son Jesus. 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Epiphany

Season of Knowing

Once the good news of those long ago promises kept was out...everyone wanted to see! There were wise folks from the East who followed the star to Bethlehem! At first, they looked in the usual places, the expected places. They looked in the palace. They asked the king. Where is this *new* king? "We want to find him and worship him," but the new king was not here. Where was he? They looked into the heavens and saw a star. They followed it and found the promised KING of ISRAEL. It was a baby. A BABY? A king would have a crown, but would a baby wear a crown? What kind of crown do you think the wise folks brought from the east? What kind of crown would the baby Jesus wear? Jesus will be called "The King of Love." How might his crown be different from a regular king's crown?

Let's add a crown to our stable scene. The crown is for a king that does not boss others around and decide who is best, but a king that welcomes everyone and gives everyone a piece of the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love of God. You might take turns hiding the crown and finding it. Where will the crown rest in your stable scene?

Second Church Star Search



Week 1

Counting on Hope
