RETREAT LEADER – REV. JILL DUFFIELD

EDITOR OF THE PRESBYTERIAN OUTLOOK

Jill Duffield currently serves as the editor and publisher of The Presbyterian Outlook, an independent publication on the PC(USA). She earned a BA in history from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, graduating magna cum laude and as a member of Phi Beta Kappa. She graduated with her Master of Divinity from Union Presbyterian Seminary and was ordained as a teaching elder in 1998. In May 2013 Jill earned her Doctor of Ministry from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Prior to becoming editor of the Outlook, she served in pastoral ministry in large and small congregations. She is a contributor to the new commentary series from John Knox Press, Connections. Her book, Lent in Plain Sight: A Devotional Through Ten Objections was published by WJK Press in December 2019. In addition, her weekly lectionary reflections was published by CSS Publishers. Lectionary Reflections for Preachers and Teachers, Year A, is currently available on Cokesbury.com. She was the 2015 and 2018 recipient of the Associated Church Press James Solheim Award for Editorial Courage. Jill is frequently asked to preach and has had the privilege of preaching at the Montreat Conference Center and lecturing at the Festival of Homiletics. She serves on the board of Austin Presbyterian Seminary and is an active participant in the Charlottesville Clergy Collective. Jill is married to Grand and they have three children, Joseph, Jessie and Marissa.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER – REV. SARA HAYDEN, Director of Apprenticeships, Residencies and Leadership Cohorts **1001 New Worshipping Communities**

Sara has served in this role since 2014. She is the host of the podcast New Way. Sara has been instrumental in the development of 1001's national apprenticeship and residency programs and cohort network, which more than 100 new worshipping community leaders turn to for mutual support and continued training. Sara is also a 1001 network coach. One of her key roles in the 1001 movement is the strategic development of national resources. She uses her experience as a regional and local new worshipping community leader to inform that work. As director of the 1001 Apprenticeship and Residency Program, Sara teaches apprentices about church-planting via weekly video seminars.

A graduate of Columbia Theological Seminary and Truman State University, Sara has also studied developmental sociology at the University of Havana. Her expertise includes recruitment and development of new worshipping community leaders, Leadership retreats, apprenticeships, and sustaining fruitful leadership cohorts. She is a coach for the Gallup Strengths Finder leadership assessment tool and has coached multiple staff teams and leadership groups in talent identification and team-building.

Sara recently moved from Atlanta to Indianapolis with her husband Chris Henry, and their two young sons, Samuel and Ben.
