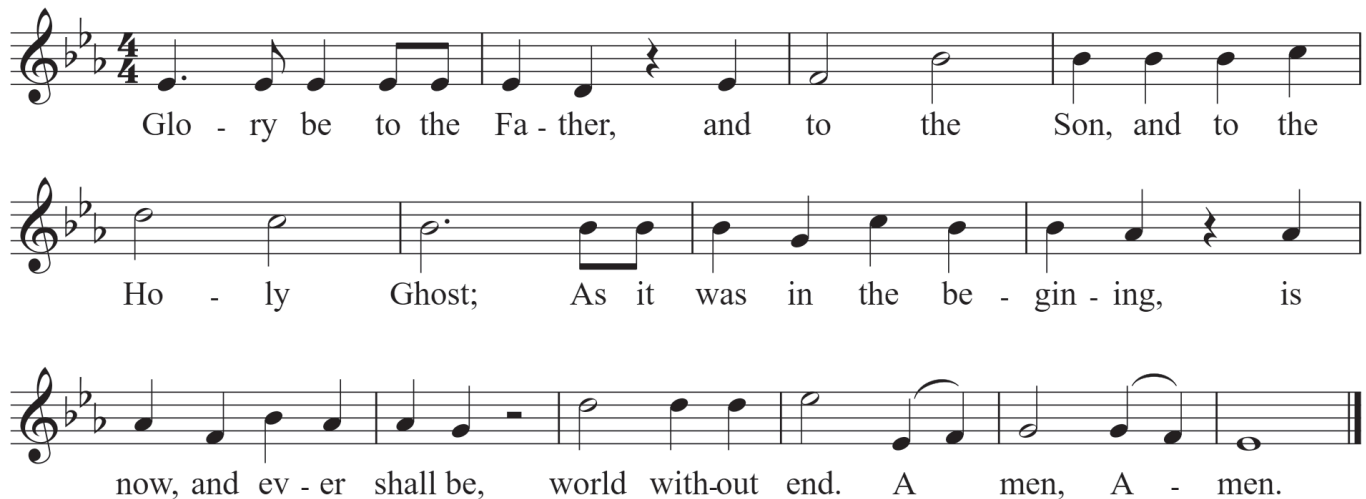
Loving God, you have planted us like a vineyard on a fertile hill.

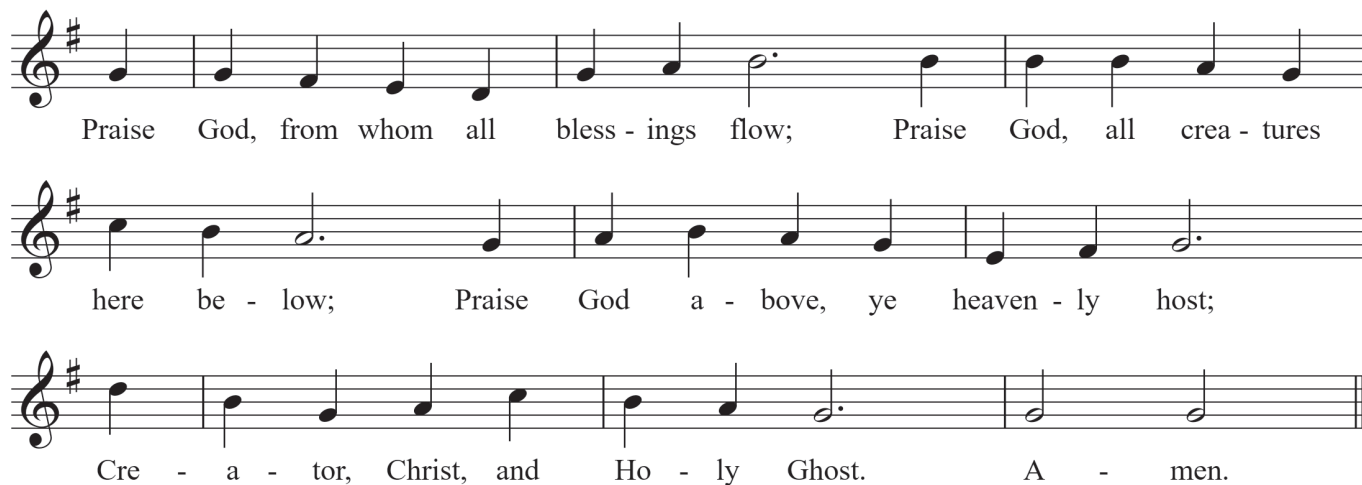

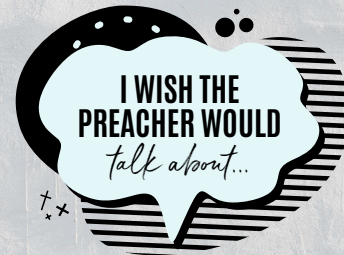
